



THE LONG ROAD TO GETTING UP CLOSE & PERSONAL










It's difficult to remember when our first chance to see Nissan's new Fairlady Z was.

It was way back in September 2020 when OZC members were online via Zoom to participate in the worldwide reveal of the Z Proto from Tokyo, Japan. The presentation started with a fabulous video of all the previous Zed generations followed by the reveal of the Z Proto. What a great-looking Z! There was a Q&A session after the reveal and as this was going on, pictures of the Zoom participants were being shown on the background wall made up of multiple TV screens. I saw shots of Diane Dale, Terry Weston & Laverne Burkhart to name a few of our members! One great thing that happened was the start of our online relationship with the Zed Car Club of Queensland, Australia (ZCCQ). Prior to the start of the presentation, all the Zoom participants were free to converse among themselves and we were intrigued to hear the word Zed being used as opposed to Zee. Who are these guys? After the exchange of a few emails, Zoom meetings were soon convened between OZC & ZCCQ with new friendships being struck.

Fast forward through all of 2021 as the Z Proto began to make the rounds at various car shows, providing enthusiasts with the opportunity to see it in person. OZC even asked Nissan Canada about the chances of the Z Proto making an appearance at our 2021 Z-Fest car show. No chance as it was busy making the rounds in the US.

Eventually, in February 2022, Nissan Canada made it known that the Fairlady Z Proto would be making an appearance at their showroom in Yorkdale Plaza. Diane Dale said that she had already been there to see it. Edmarc Arendoque had also been there and posted some photos on FB. Not wanting to miss my chance to see it, I drove up to Yorkdale. What a disappointment when I arrived. Due to Covid19 restrictions at that time, the showroom was only open on select days and to a limited number of people. You also had to book a time slot to actually get inside to see it. My visit ended up with being stuck behind a set of glass doors and windows, about 20 ft away, great view, oh well.



Next month in March, when emailing Nathalie Quesnel, Events & Sponsorship Director at Nissan Canada concerning our upcoming swap meet, I asked about the possibility of having a small group of OZC members being allowed into the Nissan Yorkdale showroom for a private viewing of the new Z. No-go as it had left Yorkdale already.


Our Prez, Lou Pereira made a few inquiries, and thanks to Thibault Pialat who manages the Zed portfolio at Nissan Canada, OZC was invited to a showing of the new Z at Nissan Canada's head office. Not only would the Proto Z be available but two production models would be too. They were about to go out on a Canada-wide dealers' tour and we only had a week to organize our viewing night. We quickly got the word out to the members and signed up our limit of 50 attendees.

A few days before the viewing I received an email from Sharp magazine. They were working on the history of the Z car with Nissan Canada. They

were given access to the new Z and wanted to get some shots with it beside each Zed car generation and asked OZC if we could supply them. The shoot was to take place in Hamilton inside a warehouse. Nissan Canada was providing a 240Z & a 350Z and being in Hamilton, Terry Weston's 350Z, Bob Chwalyk's 280ZX, and Bob Burnham's 300ZX agreed to be part of the photo shoot. In the end, their Zeds were not required but they were invited to drop by the day of the shoot. Terry showed up and had his own private viewing of a blue Fairlady Z!

The OZC event took place on a Tuesday night at Nissan's HQ in their garage. We were treated to a viewing of the Z Proto, a red Fairlady Z production model with an automatic transmission and another blue one with a manual transmission. In addition, a restored 240Z, a Z32, and a 50th anniversary 370Z were also made available. The cars were not roped off to restrict access. We were free to sit inside each one, check out the seats, steering wheel, and













interiors, and even pop the hood to check out the engine. It was quite the experience and everyone was so excited and impressed seeing the new Z models for real.

Thanks to Diane Dale, our Social Media Director, OZC members who couldn't attend the event in person were still able to participate as she set up a Zoom connection to stream the event to them live. I ended up walking around, holding Diane's laptop while she held her camera connected to the laptop to provide the video feed and a speaker as she described what was happening.

We even had a good number of our Auzzie friends from ZCCQ participating in the Zoom feed too. Our 7:00 pm start time meant a 10:00 am start time on their end so it worked out just fine for them. Nissan Canada even provided pizza and drinks for everyone attending to cap off the evening.

Thank you Nissan Canada for providing OZC with the opportunity to experience the new Fairlady Z in person! Yes, a few members wanted to place a deposit for the new Z then & there, even with no idea of how long the wait would be, let alone the cost.

The OZC Spring Swap Meet was going to be a big deal for us this year. With the loosening of the Covid19 restrictions on social gatherings, we were really looking forward to the opportunity of kicking off our 2022 events calendar with a bang.

The club is always on the lookout for new suppliers and vendors that can provide the goods and services beneficial to our members and their Zeds, both the classic models and the newer more complicated ones.

The name of Cyrious Garageworks came up as a place to hold our swap meet. One of our members, Quentin Yarie has had a ton of work done to his 240Z by Cyrious Garageworks, along with a lot of other vehicles that he owns. Many of us have seen Quentin's Zed with all the fabulous modifications to it. It's a track day and autoslalom monster, a hill-climbing racer, and a Z-Fest award winner too, due in no small way to the modifications and work done on it at Cyrious Garageworks. A call was made to Quentin and he agreed to approach Pat Cyr, the owner of Cyrious Garageworks. Quentin soon came back with the good news, Pat was willing to host the swap meet. Not only that, but to convince Pat to do this, Quentin said he would be there to help him out on the day of the event. Quentin would be bringing out his hot dog grilling set up and taking care of the food sales and service for anyone hungry that day. More on Quentin later.

Pat's garage is located in Oakville, just south of the QEW, and due east of Third Line. I drove out to the shop to go over all the details involved with hosting the swap meet, and for a tour around his place. I met with Pat and his brother Dan, who runs the office, leaving Pat to look after the shop. His setup was very impressive, with lots of working space & storage, plenty of car hoists, well organized, and very clean. After finding out what he was getting into, Pat was quite happy to host the swap meet and we had a deal. With help from our new member Rick Miron, who has volunteered to be our graphics designer, an eye-catching event flyer was created to get the word out.

As part of OZC's benefits to members, rented tables were provided free of charge this year to



those who were bringing parts to sell or swap. They just had to send in a reservation request for a vendor's table to keep things organized. Finally, I met with Diane Dale who had all kinds of good ideas to work out a program for the event and keep up the interest level of all attending. We were all set and looking forward to a great opening event for 2022.

About a week before the swap meet was to take place, not hearing anything from Quentin about his plans for the food and drinks part of the event, I tried to contact him. He got back to me and said that he had a change in plans, he would be at a race event in Kentucky that weekend and Pat now knew about it. Not wanting Pat to take on the food and refreshment workload, we decided to leave it out. An email was quickly sent out to let people know about the change in plans. Having an OZC event and providing food and drinks for the attendees hasn't been working well for us lately. Think back to Z-Fest 2021 and now the swap meet. It's not for lack of trying

anyway.

The morning of the swap meet, Diane was there early and brought out her AV equipment (speaker set up, microphone & monitor). This allowed us to stream live the Autobacs Super GT Series race from Japan where 4 teams are running the new Z car - fantastic racing! The microphone set up would save a lot of voice straining for the speakers that day. I received about 14 requests for tables from sellers bringing out parts so the tables were set up next. We had more members selling parts for the first time than our usual repeat offenders so that was a good thing as it meant more inventory on display for people to pick over. The weatherman cooperated this year as we had no rain even though nobody was selling parts outside from their car trunks or pickup beds. Grabbing the microphone, our Prez, Lou Pereira, welcomed everyone to the event and did a sales pitch on behalf of OZC, highlighting our full calendar of events for the year and encouraged lots of participation. Then it was Pat's turn.

Pat Cyr has been a gearhead for many years, a drift car competitor, rally car driver and along with his brother Dan, owns and operates Cyrious Garageworks. It has been in business now for 10 years, constantly growing and expanding the range of services provided. In Pat's words, this includes major builds, tear downs, custom fabrications, restorations, roll cages modifications of all kinds. With a desire to keep

most of the major work done in-house, Pat also added a body shop complete with a paint shop and a down draft paint booth. This ensures that he can provide quality control, scheduling and timely completion of his work, thereby keeping customers happy. The swap meet was actually set up in the body shop, so we had plenty of room. On Sunday May 15 OZC embarked on the newly renamed "Spring Tour". This used to be the "Halton Tour", but since the route was new we thought it best to give it a fresh new name!

It was my pleasure to see our members and non club members again after two years. The weather was absolutely perfect for a Sunday Drive. Thanks again to Manolo and Lee for making sure we did not lose anyone on the tour.

This year's tour took a new route - over 170km and 5 hours we covered a number of spots including:

- starting in Grimsby travelling along Ridge Road and back up to lake Ontario
- travelling all the way south to lake Erie
- stopping for lunch in Port Colborne
- back up past Welland, through Fonthill
- · west through Jordan, Beamsville

Some of our members wanted to know more about the painted houses on her first stop.

Grimsby Beach is an historic neighbourhood comprised of a number of unique historical landmarks and homes, commonly referred to as "gingerbread cottages" or "painted ladies". Apart from the local homes, the area consists of parks and greenspace, including waterfront access to Lake Ontario. The area is connected by a unique street network as well, formed by narrow cul-de-sacs and dead end streets.

Grimsby Beach was used by Euro-Canadian settlers as a religious gathering place in the mid-19th century, which became known as a "Methodist Campground."

By the 1870s, canvas and post tents were being replaced with wood-frame cottages, known as permanent tents.

Many of the historic homes predate 1945. Several have been protected as significantly cultural heritage resources under the Ontario Heritage Act.

We hope you enjoyed the tour, thanks to everyone who joined in!



This month we're excited to start introducing you to some of our new friends from ZCCQ. It really is amazing to learn how similar our backgrounds and passions are - especially when it comes to Z cars.

In 1980, when I was just 18 years old, I married my childhood sweetheart Owen Lloyd (aka Lloydy) who was six years my senior. Wow, he seemed so mature and experienced. He loved fast cars and to double clutch between gears. Everyone knew when he was coming. Lloydy came from a family that loved horses. His mother, Joyce Lloyd, won The Australian Lady Camp Drafter in her late 50s. Apparently, she would frequently tell how as a young boy, Lloydy would have sticks in his saddle for 'changing gears'.










In 1978 Lloydy bought what I think was a blue 1971 Datsun 240Z. Sadly, he loved to drive fast on dirt roads and with just a little bit of alcohol in the mix one night, he wrapped it around a tree. My younger brother was passenger and luckily, they both walked away without a scratch, but the love of his life - his first Z- was written off.

Lloydy loved his Zs and he soon wanted another. In May 1981 we drove 6 hours from Rockhampton to Deception Bay, just outside



Brisbane, and bought a 1971 Datsun 240Z (00874). It was Safari Gold - not our favourite colour.

Lloydy's mother gave him a horseshoe that he put on the front of the car to keep him safe. In 1982 he changed the colour to British Racing Green.

In 1983 we drove from Rockhampton to Perth across the Nullabor Plain (2892miles/4650km 51 hours) which was our last holiday before having children. Lloydy drove at 100 miles per hour for hours on end with the throttle pulled full on as a cruise control! This was while he explained to me the workings of an engine from go to whoa! Not that I remember very much.

In July 1984 we had our first child, Brendan. The Z was not really an ideal family car but that didn't stop us from taking Brendan with us in a wicker baby bassinet my sister had gifted us. Lloydy put a harness over the bassinet in the back seat and tied it down so tight, the harness nearly touched Brendan. That bassinet wasn't going anywhere!

As it didn't suit our growing family, the Z was sadly sold on 21 November 1984 to B. T Coe. He had it for 10 years, then sold it in October 1994 to the next owner who had it for 2 years. Then Brian Dunn, a member of the Z Car Club, bought it in May 1996. Brian raced it and owned it for 11 years. He sold it in September 2007 to Greg Holgate who I bought it back from in June 2021.

How did I know where it was? Well sadly Lloydy passed away in September 2017 in Brisbane, where we were living. He had some 1980s Z Car magazines which I had been carrying around in a box. Thinking I didn't need them, I asked one of Lloydy's previous work mates, Glen, who was in a Classic Car group in Rockhampton if he knew someone who might want them. He gave them to the then owner of our original Z, who lived in the street next to my mother. He said, "If ever you would like to see it, it is covered up with a blanket." I wasn't really interested.

So, what made me decide to buy it? I currently cycle around Brisbane for fitness and on Wednesdays, I ride with a group called RPM





(Retired Persons Meander). Each week early in 2021 we would ride past a house that had a car covered up by a blanket. It looked like a Z and it made me think of our car. So, trying to impress the old fellows in the group (mostly 70+) I told them about the Z. Then one day I thought how cool it would be to buy it back if the owner ever wanted to sell. I mentioned this to my eldest son Brendan, who said "Mum why do you do this to









me?" So, he rang Glen who gave him the owner's number. The owner (Greg) wasn't intending to sell but as he knew my husband and they had worked together back in the 80s, he thought it would be nice for us to have it. He may have thought we had it from new, which we didn't. Regardless, he and his wife kindly sold it to us for a good price.

Greg and Denise had owned our Z for 14 years and in that time, they had it repainted red (not a Datsun colour) after cutting out a small amount of rust. Greg hadn't been driving it as it was low, and he had trouble getting in and out. He also owns two other classic cars. After getting it road worthy, which only needed four new tyres and a tune up, the Z was back in our family. Greg and the previous owners even kept an old exercise book, that Lloydy started, updated with work completed. There are a couple of speedo readings in my handwriting from the 80s. Very special.

Now I have a kind friend that loves to work on the Z. The carbies have been pulled down and it is running well with an electronic ignition and some other improvements. I sourced and installed the original seats that were in the car during our 1983 Perth trip. This April the engine will be removed to fix a couple of oil leaks and enable a repaint of the engine bay which is the British Racing Green that Lloydy had it painted.

The Z is now a family heirloom for our two sons, our daughter and our two grandsons. Brendan and I have enjoyed some lovely drives in it together, though now (37 years later) Brendan prefers to sit in the front.

Thank you to all the previous owners who looked after the Z so well for us. Special thanks to Greg and Denise Holgate for their kindness in allowing me to buy it for a second time. The Z is treasured for so many reasons.

How did you happen to find out about OZC?

"I loved the look of classic cars especially Zeds and started a search online, looking to pick up one.I came across the OZC website and the club









really grabbed my interest. After I bought my 280ZX, I showed up at a bunch of OZC events, like the Micra Cup race at Canadian Tire Motorsport Park, a swap meet and a number of the road tours.I found the members very welcoming and enjoyed the social aspects of the club."

It was great to see another S130 brought into the club.What's the background story on how you found yours?



"After selling the Civic, I had a couple of cars in mind for my next purchase. A 280ZX was at the top of my list. I already had my eye on one that looked to be in great shape; however, it was out of my price range. Instead I went to go check out a cheaper one in Ottawa that needed some TLC.After seeing it in person, I wasn't sold on it and made my way back home empty handed.I then decided to check out the higher priced 280ZX for the hell of it.I made the trip to Brantford on a rainy Saturday and instantly fell in love as soon as the garage door opened. I knew I had to have it and a deal was made."

When I first saw your Zed, I was amazed how good it looked especially as it was locally owned and driven. The paint finish looked great and the interior was good too, a classic stock look.

"I loved that Zed, such a fun car to drive, and it grew on Landon too.He would see me working on it and would just watch me at first, then he wanted to go for a ride in it and help me wash it and shine it up."

So what happened? Despite winning an award at Z-Fest last year, I was quite surprised to see it posted for sale on FB.

"I enjoyed driving my S130 but the 50th anniversary edition 300ZX was always a dream car of mine and I happened to be in Gilford near our family cottage.I couldn't believe my luck. There was a 1984 300ZX turbo on sale, a 50th anniversary edition one. The owner was a retired gentleman and after checking out the car,

I bargained long and hard but in the end, I pretty well paid what he was asking."

Here's a bit of background history on this particular Zed, thanks to Google. The 1984 300ZX was badged as a 50th anniversary car because it celebrated the 5-decade anniversary of Nissan's founding in December 1933. Over 5000 units were manufactured for the US and only 300 were built for Canada. It is indeed a rare car.

Chris mentioned that he wasn't really in the market for another Zed but he just couldn't pass up the opportunity to own a 50th anniversary edition.He posted his 280ZX for sale in the Fall of 2021 but only received low ball offers, nothing serious and the car was pulled off the market.In the end, Chris found a guy interested in picking up classic Japanese cars. Next this guy shipped all the cars purchased to the Middle East, to buyers that were lined up for them. He met Chris' price and the Zed was sold and driven away earlier in January this year, on a nice snow free day and on a dry salt free road!
























This year was our tenth year hosting the OZC Kawartha tour.
