For a number of reasons, (rising postal costs, printing costs, the work associated with labelling envelopes, placing stamps on them, adding inserts, Covid-19 social distancing protocols), the Executive Committee decided to send Zedline out in digital format only. No more member mailings meant that it was hard to justify the expense of mailing out membership cards on their own.

What we have been doing is handing out membership cards at our early season events to those members in attendance. **We will be happy to mail out your 2023 membership card but on a request basis only.**Just send an email requesting one to me, where been seem.

Here are a few reminders concerning the OZC membership policy:

1) The membership year starts on January 1 and ends on December 31 of the same year;

2) Dues are currently \$45 per year, regardless of what month of the current year they are paid;

3) Any OZC member who brings in a new first time applicant to join the club, will receive a 50% dues discount for the following membership year;

4) Anyone who joins the club with an out-of-province resident address, will receive a dues reduction from \$45 down to \$25;

5) Every OZC member is assigned a unique membership number for record purposes, regardless of your membership status, ie: current member, former member returning to the club.

Lastly, please ensure you notify me should you change your contact information or mailing address at any time.

Jack's facts on his Datsun's and his Diecast collection. Enjoy!

1976 Datsun 280Z owned for 39 years. He is

currently swapping in a new'ish VQ37VHR engine and 6spd CD0009 transmission into the S30 and fabricating the required parts for a swap kit to be sold. Installing a Vortech V3 Centrifugal Supercharger on this VQ37 engine and also developing the parts required to do so. The end goal is to compete in the Optima Ultimate Street Car Challenge in the US and take a shot at the Hot Wheels Legend Tour.



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1967 Datsun Roadster 1600. Short windshield, flat dash model all original matching numbers. He has the 2L U20 engine with the Solex carbs, intake manifold, and 'B' cam 'factory hod rod' setup for near future swap when the engine is rebuilt. Street car for cruises and shows.

2016 Nissan 370Z 6spd. Owned since new. Full suspension mods, intake, exhaust and ECU tune. Primarily for lapping days and occasional cruise nights.

1972 Datsun 510, 2Dr 1.8L 4spd. Restomod, with a special theme, build also planned for the 510 in the near future.

Jack's Diecast collection. He believes his Datsun/Nissan die-cast / toy collection is one of the largest in Canada.

Most models and years are represented. Brands include Hot Wheels, Matchbox, Corgi, Dinky Toy, Johnny Lightning, Solido, Greenlight, Burago, M2, Kyosho, Tonka, Transformers (Hasbro), Scalextric etc.





















Notable collectables include:

A mint condition 240Z Tonka toy released back in the mid 70's.

An extremely rare mint condition 240Z slot car (1/32 scale) released by Riggen Model Racing. Its in pristine condition.

He has a Hot Wheels Gold Edition 1976 Datsun 280Z released in 1978.

A very rare, mint condition Black issue 1976 Datsun 280Z, only released in France back in the late 70's.

Two mint condition variations of '81 280ZX Transformers toys released in the early 80's.

One of his favorite collectables is a pristine 1973 Datsun 240Z in BRE livery Corgi diecast that is still in the original box and never been removed. It was purchased in the UK in 1973 from a lady living in Turkey who traveled to Britain to purchase several new Corgi diecast models for her son's birthday. Apparently, he was only allowed to open one of 25+ pieces she purchased (he opened a farm tractor - go figure?). Jack acquired the 240Z BRE from this Turkish lady, and also acquired a brand new, never opened Batmobile and Bat Boat on Bring A Trailer (BAT) from the original TV show, also released by Corgi in the early 70's.

Of honorable mention is Jack's 1/64 scale AFX BRE Datsun 240Z and BRE Datsun 510 slot cars that he received in 1973 for his 12thBirthday from his mom! They are still in good working condition 50 years later.

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WHEN IS THE BEST LINE...?

OZC MEMBER TIPS ON Z CAR MAINTENANCE









There has been lots of discussion over the years as to the best time to change your oil, put your snow tires on, how to store a vehicle for the winter.... and the list goes on. Some may say, if it's not broke don't fix it. Well in my opinion preventive maintenance can benefit in the long run, catching a small deficiency before it becomes a catastrophic failure or catches you off guard at the most inopportune time

Maintaining four family vehicles 2005 - 2009 starts with snow tire change overs in late October along with brake inspection/lubrication. Then out comes "Trusty" multi- meter to check the charging system and a visual check of all visible belts. What better time to clean the battery & terminals with baking soda in warm water, ensuring a good connection. Oil changes, using synthetic oil, are based on mileage which often falls in September or February..

Projects of smaller magnitude for me often take place during the winter months, with no set time schedule. Datsun "240" is due for new vent hoses on the fuel tank. Belmetric.com is a good source of original style hose. "Handy Jack"and a hair dryer aid with the tank removal. Inspection of the sender unit follows, including contacts and resistance even though the gauge was working. Just because! Installation goes well with the copper U bend installed years ago on the main vent.

Since I was working at the rear of the car and two of the interior panels were removed, the addition of parking lights on a switch entertained some creative juices. Why not entertain an improvement on sound deadening since my car's Db is significant. Google and compare specs and pricing, I end up with Kilmat, yet to be installed in warmer weather.

Moving forward it's time to get to the bottom of an annoying pulsation under heavy higher speed braking. Rotors look good but are they really? They have been on the car since 2008 with multiple track days included. Out come the dial gauge and "Vernier". Not surprising there is a low area. Decision time, new or resurface?

In this day and age of throw new parts at it mentality, I chose to go old school and source a









reputable machine shop and have them stone ground. Apart come the front hub/rotor assemblies, and being old school, the inner and outer bearings are replaceable.

Let's take a look at their condition. As we can see the bearing cup shows a little wear after 180,000 miles. Punch out the old preferably with a brass punch, then freeze and tap in new.

Brake pads got a block sanding to create a new flat surface. Hubs were cleaned, and new Amsoil synthetic grease applied ready for reassembly and torqueing.

So glad its finally spring!

We are so excited to continue our feature of the members and events of our "sister club" the Z Car Club of Queensland, Australia!


This month it's about Lofty Drews - or more importantly about the annual drive that the ZCCQ organizes each year to his home.

Whatever Happened to the First North American Z Car?

Maybe you know this story... but it car of course!!! certainly is a good one to be told over and over again. A legend to pass on to our children. For generations and generations of Zowners to come. Back in late 1969 Nissan shipped three of its new Datsun 240z's (chassis #HLS30-00006, #HLS30-00007 and #HLS30-00008) to tour the North American auto shows. During the tour (oddly enough - at the Toronto Auto Show), one of the show models sat on the roof and dented it. Now ... what do you do with a perfectly brand new car that can't be photographed or re-sold to the public? Turn it into a race

Interesting Fact: The first five Z cars have never been seen. It is assumed that they were destroyed at the factory in testing. So the beloved #00006 is really the first international Z car - not just the first in North America.

Bob Sharp Racing took possession of the car and prepared #33 for SCCA C Production racing in 1970. A second Z car joined BSR (with driver Jim Fitzgerald) late in 1970 (both were branded with the oh-so-notorious red, white and blue BSR paint scheme). #33's first year out was with driver Bob

Sharp and the car became the first 240z to win a SCCA national race. In 1972 and 1973 it won the C Production National Championship. When Jim Fitzgerald left BSR in 1974, he took the original Z car (which had became #38) and continued competing in SCCA C Production until 1979 when he switched to a 280zx. Fitzgerald ran IMSA predominantly when it visited his home track of Road Atlanta and at least one Trans Am race - the last race he ran with #00006 was the last race held at Virginia International Raceway (VIR) before the track was rebuilt – and he won! This original 240z is credited with having won over 250 races before its first retirement. What an accomplishment!

Interesting Fact: the Brock Racing Enterprises (BRE) Racing Team headed by Peter Brock (with Driver John Morton) also raced a Datsun 240z starting in late 1970. However, they had to wait for the regular shipment of Z Cars to the U.S. (the first 20 cars for re-sale shipped in January of 1970), so the BSR team actually got their Datsun first! (Both the BSR and BRE teams gualified for the C Production class at the Runoffs

with roadsters!)

Now what you may not know about the original chassis #00006 race car is that it was subsequently purchased and brought out of retirement by a passionate Z car enthusiast, Dr. Allan Robbins. Allan is an honored and well-respected Z historian. Today this car can be seen racing in its astounding original-condition-glory at various events around the U.S. - many of which are right in our own U.S. backyard, Watkins Glen. The car's current engine is an E31 block and head (exactly as the original was prepared). Porting and polishing were done by Dave Rebello in California; the compression ratio and cam specs are a carefully guarded secret - adding to the awe and mystery of this car.

Interesting Fact: The first shipload of Z cars to the U.S. are the only ones that had crankshafts with only six full counterweights (others had eight). This caused clutch and flywheel problems during races. BSR had special billet cranks built to overcome this, but #00006 now runs the stock crankshaft with careful balancing and race preparation – and that seems to be quite reliable.

Dr. Allan Robbins, a prominent ophthalmologist who performs laser surgery in Rochester, New York, formed SharpSight Motorsports Inc. in 1992 as his tribute to racing Datsuns. (There's a great picture of his 240z on his professional website www.lasik-rochester.net) At the time he and his friends owned three of the original BSR race cars, so the motorsports name came easily. The SharpSight Motorsports team captured the New York State Road Racing Championship in G Production and GT-2 in 1995 and 1996 and continues competitive racing to this day.

Interesting Fact: the current SharpSight inventory includes other historical BSR and Electramotive race cars including Bob Sharp's personal 1971 Datsun 240z street car (in red of course). SharpSight is currently restoring the Electramotive 280ZX that won the IMSA GTU championship in 1979 with Don Devendorf. They hope to have it ready for the Japanese Sports Car feature at the Classic Motorsports Walter Mitty Challenge at Road Atlanta at the end of April. (www.hsrrace.com)

Allan's longtime passion with Z cars started in 1970 when the car first came out. He followed Z cars as a hobby – watching Bob Sharp race, visiting his dealership, following Paul Newman's career and many other aspirations. His documented passion includes a scrap book that any Datsun Z fan would love to get their hands on... pictures, slides, negatives, promotional brochures, race results, racing specifications, tech sheets. I felt simply honored to even get a glimpse, never mind a personal tour.

Allan started the racing portion of his hobby with a 1963 Porsche 356 coupe. After acquiring a truck, trailer and the famed BSR Datsun 240z in 1991, his dreams came true. For the last 14 years he's been racing the Z at the likes of Lime Rock, Sebring, Elkhart Lake and most predominantly Watkins Glen. This year they're preparing one of the Datsun cars for SCCA E Production class and are hoping to be competitive there.

SharpSight's 2006 race schedule starts out strong this year... The HSR Race at Sebring (March 2 – 5), The Mitty at Road Atlanta (April 27 – 30), Watkins Glen Historic Races (June 15 – 18). Be sure to watch for the blur of the red, white and blue.
